

Green carts aren't just for green waste any more.


Mid Valley Disposal is moving towards the next step to increase diversion by adding food waste to the green carts, keeping it out of landfill.

In addition to the grass, plant & garden clippings, tree prunings and untreated wood, you can now place the following in your Green container:

- Fruits & Vegetables
- Pasta & Rice
- Eggshells & Nutshells
- Bread & Grains
- Coffee Grounds & Filters



These items will eventually be converted to compost which will be sold to farmers to grow more food. This will take our food waste through the recycling process.



The proposed increase to utility service fees of \$1.54 per month, if adopted, will go into effect on July 1, 2014.

The public hearing will provide customers an opportunity to learn more about the proposed rates and/or to protest the proposed rate increase.


