



The State Water Resources Control

Board (SWRCB) recently applied a climate adjustment that reduced CVWD's mandatory conservation target from 36% to 32%

CVWD customers will now only need to limit their outdoor water use to 32% below their regular outdoor water budget.

CVWD's rolling average conservation number through January, which is what the state uses to judge performance, is 25.5%. This is in line with the statewide average.

**Possible water rate changes for drinking water customers**



**CALIFORNIA'S NEW CHROMIUM-6 REGULATION**

Proactive upgrades and improvements to the water system are critical to serve the 318,000 residents that depend on CVWD for reliable water service every day.



As part of our ongoing effort to provide alternate ways for customers to connect with CVWD, we are offering different options for receiving our Annual Review & Water Quality Report, also known as the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR).

The Annual Review includes a look at the year's accomplishments, completed projects, current water issues and future plans.

Customers can opt to have an electronic version emailed, view it online or continue to receive a print version by mail. The report is posted online by July 1 each year.


- **CVWD customers show commitment to conservation**  
CVWD invested more than \$6.5 million in conservation programs this year and residents have taken advantage of these programs in record numbers.
- **Groundwater replenishment remains key district priority**  
CVWD and DWA have jointly replenished more than 3.3 million acre-feet of imported water into the aquifer.
- **Domestic and sewer projects include chromium-6 work**  
The project is estimated to cost approximately \$250 million and comes after the state announced a new Maximum Contaminant Level for the mineral that occurs naturally in large portions of the Coachella Valley's groundwater aquifer at levels above the new MCL.

### CVWD issues Annual Review and Water Quality Report

Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD) has released its Annual Review and Water Quality Report, highlighting water-related issues from the past fiscal year.

Included in the report is the Consumer Confidence Report for 2016, an annual summary of drinking water quality. CVWD is committed to delivering high-quality drinking water. Water is delivered to customers from wells drilled into the Coachella Valley's groundwater basin.

Highly trained employees monitor the water systems and collect drinking water samples that are tested at CVWD's state-certified laboratory.

As an additional public service, the Annual Review also includes valuable information on CVWD conservation programs, groundwater replenishment, domestic and sewer projects including the Chromium-6 Treatment project, and more.

The report is mailed or emailed to customers and distributed at public gathering areas, such as city halls, libraries and senior centers. California water utilities are required to provide annual water quality reports to their customers through printed or electronic means.

CVWD provides customers the opportunity to opt out of receiving a paper copy of the Annual Review and instead view the report online or receive an electronic copy by email. To sign up for this option for future years, visit [www.cvwd.org/optout](http://www.cvwd.org/optout).



## Water Quality

Coachella Valley Water District's top priority is delivering high quality drinking water that meets stringent government standards. Highly trained employees collect drinking water samples and monitor the water system for more than 100 regulated and non-regulated chemicals. Most tests are conducted at the CVWD's state-certified laboratory in Coachella. A few specialized tests are performed by other certified laboratories.



Each year, CVWD produces an annual water quality report that documents that the drinking water served to all CVWD's users (obtained from wells drilled into the Coachella Valley's groundwater basin) meets stringent state and federal drinking water quality standards.
