The Castaic Lake Water Agency (CLWA) and the local water retailers (CLWA Santa Clarita Water District Waterworks District #36 (LACWW#36), Newhall County Water District (NCWD) and Valencia Water Company) have a reliable and high quality water supply at a reasonable price. We are committed to maintaining an excellent water supply for our customers. This 2016 Annual Water Quality Report describes in detail the quality of local water supplies over the past 10 years past, your tap water met all USEPA and State drinking water health standards. We are currently entering the fifth year of drought. While normal precipitation in northern portions of the State, California has not yet recovered from the drought, residents need to continue to conserve water both inside and outside the home. Regularly check your sprinklers, toilets and faucets for leaks.




